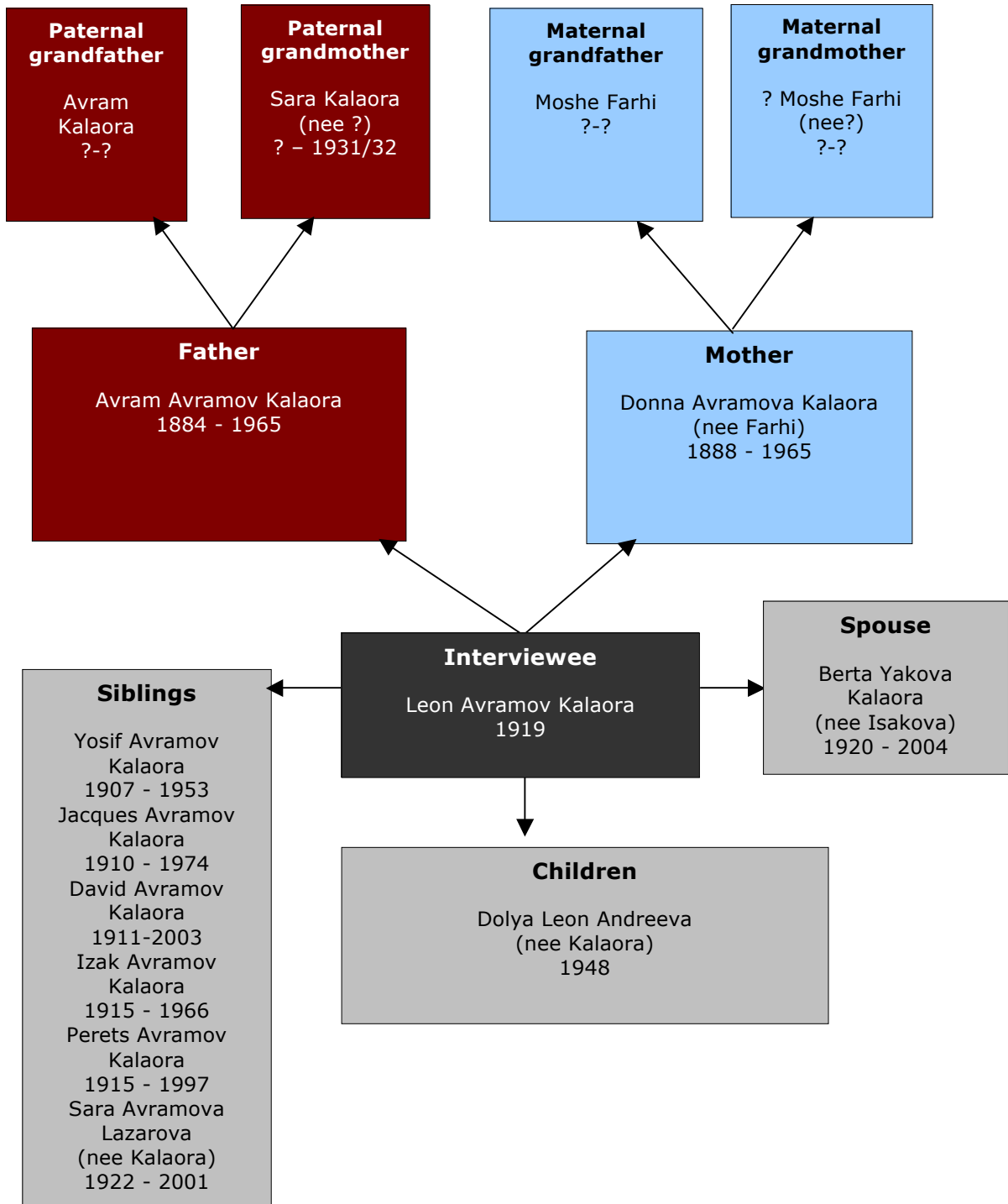

Isak Yakov Isakov – born on 12th February 1937 in Gorna Dzhumaya, finished high school, moderately religious, married, two children.

Buka Yakova Haravon (nee Isakova) – born in 1912/13 in Gorna Dzhumaya. Married to Samuel Haravon from Kyustendil, who worked as a tinsmith.

Where was he during the Holocaust?

During the Law for the Protection of the Nation he was first in Sofia (1942) and then interned with his family to Shumen (1943); he did not work in Jewish labor camps because of his age (only young and healthy Jewish men were mobilized in the camps).

He did not work, in Israel he was supported by his sons.


