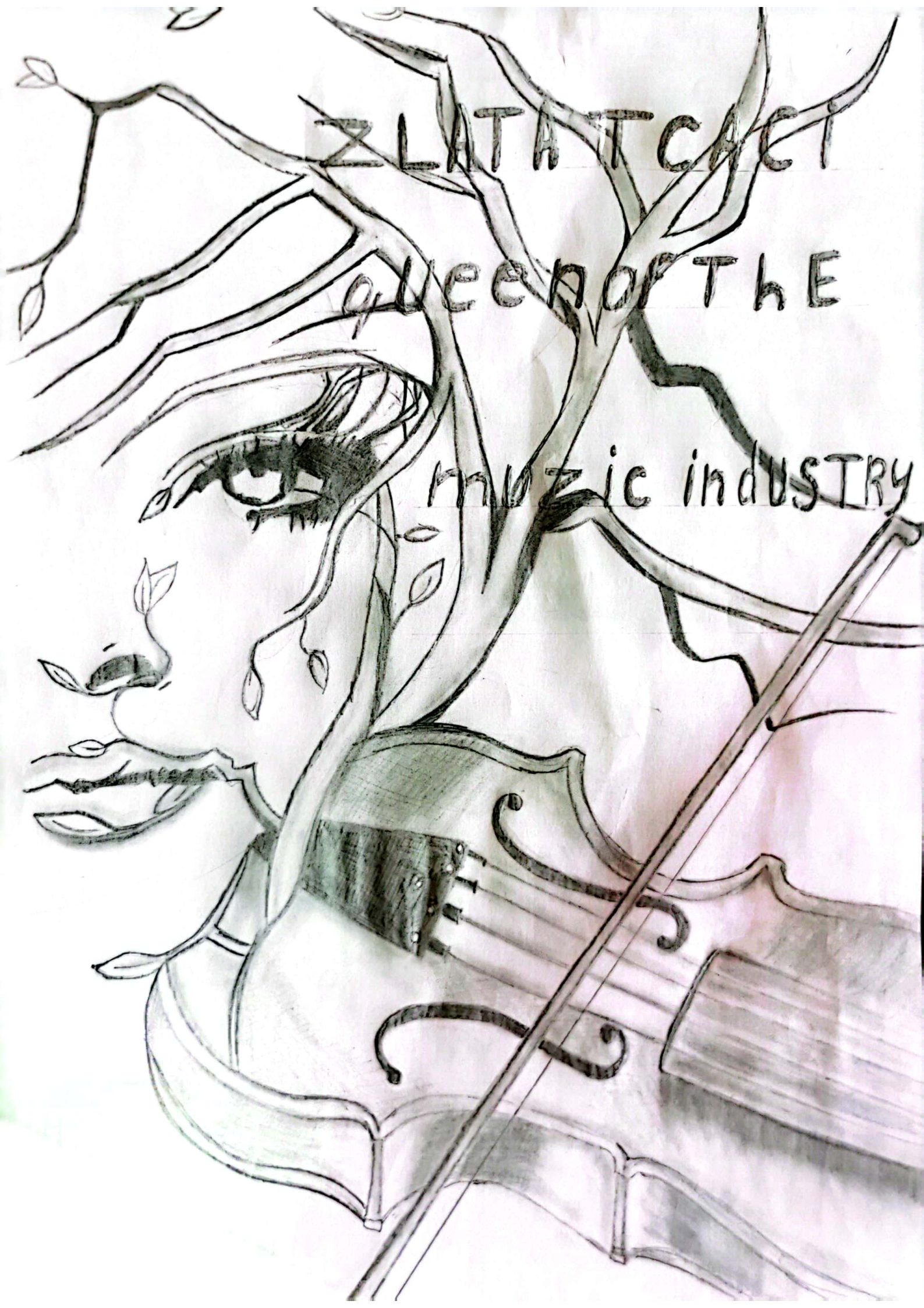

Glata Teaci queen of the music industry.

- Glata Teaci was born on May 16, 1928 in Iosoreo where her grandmother Henia had a business. When Glata was 3 years old she moved with her mother's parents to Chisinau.
- Glata's father was a musician. When Glata was 3 years old, her father started teaching her to play the violin. Glata did not have a nanny when she was little, her mother had educated her.
- Glata studied in a primary school, after that school she went to the high school "Queen Mary" where the best students studied. In addition to school, she also took violin and piano lessons. In 1940 there was a terrible earthquake in which she was saved by her father, and in 1941 the war began.
- Nazi Germany attacked the Soviet Union without declaring war. Thus the so-called patriotic war had begun, caught off guard, the Soviet forces lost heavily. In October 1941, the Nazi Germany army seized the Ukrainian Republic. The war ended on 9 May 1945.
- Glata Teaci composed works for children and adults. She married a young man named Yefim and had a son Lev. Her father was happy that she worked with music, but in 1985 his father died in a serious accident, he lived 15 years longer than his wife. Glata had in his life many concerts, meetings and much more in Israel. She was the most famous songwriter at the time, adored by children and adults alike. In 2003 her husband died of cancer. During her husband's life time, they witnessed the revival of Jewish life in Chisinau.
